Rev. Timothy McCarthy

Parochial vicar in Milton; at 32

Rev. Timothy C. McCarthy, parochial vicar at St. Agatha's Church in Milton, since October 1986, died of a cerebral hemorrhage Wednesday at Boston City Hospital. He was 32 and a lifelong resident of South Boston.

A 1975 graduate of Don Bosco High School, he prepared for the priesthood at St. John's Seminary and was ordained June 8, 1985 at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross by Cardinal Bernard F. Law.

Father McCarthy was parochial vicar at St. Anthony's Church in Allston before being assigned to St. Agatha's. He was also chaplain to the Milton Police Department and an honorary life member of Pere Marquette Knights of Columbus Council 271 of South Boston. Before his ordination he served as a deacon at St. Mary's Church in Lynn.

He leaves his parents, Charles and Pauline (Sidonio) McCarthy of South Boston; two sisters, Mary McCarthy-Collins and Paulina McCarthy, and three brothers, Joseph, Christopher and Charles Jr., all of South Boston.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. Monday in Gate of Heaven Church, South Boston, with Cardinal Law the principal celebrant.

Arthur L. Gaskill, 81

Retired news cameraman

Services will be held at 11 a.m. today in the Church of the Good Shepherd in Acton for Arthur L. Gaskill of Acton, a retired news cameraman.

Mr. Gaskill, known to his friends as Nemo, died of heart disease Wednesday in Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital. He was 81 and a former resident of Falmouth and Melrose.

He retired in 1970 after a decade with NBC News. He began in the late 1920s with Paramount Pictures and later worked for MGM, Movietone News and United Press International.

During World War II he served as an officer at the Army Signal Corps Photography School in Astoria, N.Y., on Long Island. He supervised picture-taking at the Quebec, Potsdam and Yalta conferences of Allied leaders and at the Japanese surrender ceremony aboard the battleship USS Missouri. He was discharged as a colonel.

He leaves his wife, Naomi (Matthews); a daughter, Betty McManus of Acton; a son, Dean of Newton; and three grandchildren.
