- WHEREAS: Since 1983 students, ministers and other volunteers of this shelter have provided a safe haven to which those in need can turn for a place to sleep and something to eat during the cold winter months; and
- WHEREAS: The Harvard Square Homeless Shelter is directed by undergraduates from the Homeless Committee of Harvard's Phillips Brooks House, making it the only student-run shelter in the country; and
- WHEREAS: Every night 23 men and women are guests of the shelter and another 25 are offered food when beds are full; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is pleased to be home to a shelter with such a caring and professional staff who for the last 16 years have provided those in need with top quality assistance and guidance; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby congratulates the Harvard Square Homeless Shelter on this its reopening and thanks its entire staff of volunteers for their hard work and dedication; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented to the Harvard Square Homeless Shelter on behalf of the entire City Council.

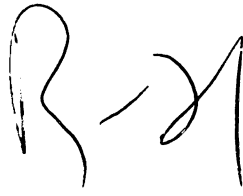
