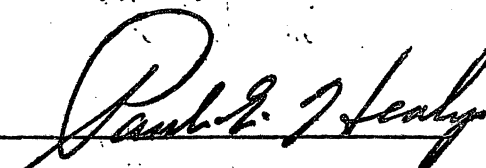

- WHEREAS: This City Council was saddened to hear that Lessie Klein, a Cambridge resident active in her neighborhood and as a volunteer at the Margaret Fuller House, and a member of the Economic Conversion Committee of the Cambridge Peace Commission, was killed on November 24, 1985 in a tragic automobile accident in Nepal as she was on her way to help organize the War Resisters International Triennial Conference in India; and
- WHEREAS: Lessie spent many years as an activist, practicing and supporting non-violent means to bring peace and justice to the world, with groups such as the American Friends Service Committee, the Bay State Center for Economic Conversion, and the International Seminars on Training for Nonviolent Action; and
- WHEREAS: Lessie was a guiding light in the Pilot Project, endorsed by this City Council in June, that brings together the Cambridge Peace Commission with Cambridge companies in an attempt to develop plans for converting from military to peace-oriented enterprises; and
- WHEREAS: Lessie's friends will deeply miss her cheerful, optimistic spirit and her will and devotion to bringing peace to our world; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council hereby honors the life and work of Lessie Klein; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution be presented to Lessie's family.
