IN BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN, [
Nov. 16, 1874.]

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience require that Pearl Street should be widened on its northwesterly side, by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land belonging to Solomon Hancock, Davis & Pike and Edward Hixon; that River street should be widened on its northerly side from Central Square to Blackstone Street,—and that Moore street should be laid out thirty feet in width, from Washington street to Broadway.

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the persons above named, the abutters on said River and Moore Streets, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to widen and lay out the Streets before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as public streets,—and that

the thirtieth day of November current, at 8 o'clock P. M.,

is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
