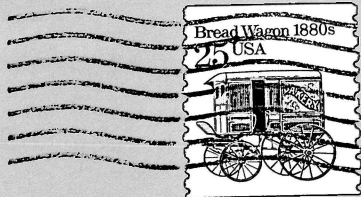
I have just read an update on the Cambridge Laboratory Animals Ordinance to the Blue Ribbon Committee. I agree totally with the concept of citizen review, especially if our taxes are paying for the experiments. One fact which I read particularly enrages me ... & that is the refusal of the Cambridge institutions using animals to release the protocols of experiments! Why can't the City of Cambridge legally force this from them?

The protocols are the heart of the matter. As I understand it, even an unannounced inspection will only reveal the state of the living quarters, & the condition of animals before or after experiments. Since the animals cannot tell us what they have been through, we must depend on protocols to read. Please cut through the arrogance & unaccountability of these institutions & obtain this information for the Blue Ribbon Committee. Thank You!
