Anthony Vanaria, Waltham dentist

Dr. Anthony A. Vanaria died Sunday in his home in Waltham, where he had practiced dentistry for 46 years. He was 91.

Dr. Vanaria was a lifelong resident of Waltham. He graduated from Boston College and Tufts University Dental School.

After serving in the Army Medical Corps during World War II, he practiced in Waltham from 1947 until retiring in 1993.

He was a former chairman of the Waltham Council of Boy Scouts, which honored him with its Silver Beaver Award.

He leaves his wife, Doris E. (Pruy); a son, Anthony of Carlsbad, Calif.; two daughters, Marilyn V. Steinert of North Andover and Linda L. 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Peter Gennaro, won Tony Award

Peter Gennaro, a dancer who choreographed television variety programs, occasional motion pictures and some of Broadway's biggest shows, earning a Tony Award for his work on the hit musical "Annie," died Sept. 28 at Mt. Sinai Hospital in New York City. He was 80.

As a dancer, Mr. Gennaro appeared in Broadway's "Kiss Me Kate," "Guys and Dolls," and "The Pajama Game."

In addition to "Annie," he choreographed such musicals as "West Side Story," sharing credit with Jerome Robbins, the Pulitzer Prize-winning "Fiorello!" and "Mr. President."

Mr. Gennaro was familiar to a generation of television viewers in the 1950s and 1960s for his dancing and choreography, often with his Peter Gennaro Dancers, on programs such as "Kraft Music Hall," "The Perry Como Show," and "Your Hit Parade."
