RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council congratulates the President on signing, as an important step toward the elimination of the nuclear threat.

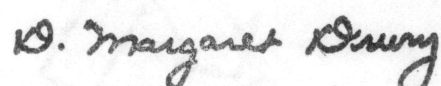
