- WHEREAS: Through the pages of the Cambridge Chronicle of June 1, 1989 we learned of the imminent closing of Blessed Sacrament Elementary School on Cpl. McTernan Street; and
- WHEREAS: The long-spoken-of need for a city-wide Senior Citizen Center has yet to be met, yet to be discussed in depth, with no report emanating from the City Manager relative thereto, despite my Council Order of October 17, 1988 (affirmed by vote of the Council membership) concerning this matter; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager communicate with the Pastor of the Blessed Sacrament Parish for the purpose of finding out what he and the officials of the Archdiocese of Boston contemplate regarding future disposition of the school building. Depending on what is learned therefrom, it may well be that the school building could be purchased, modified and become the site for a city-wide Senior Citizen Center; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council regarding this inquiry before June 30, 1989.
