City of Cambridge June 2nd 1838

The Committee on Roads & Bridges to whom the petition of James Munroe was referred asking that the Superintendent of Streets, should examine that part of Williard St in Ward One which has broken away and if in his opinion a bank Wall should be laid, that he be authorized to contract for the same, have attended to their duty and ask leave to report.

The Committee have examined said street, and they find a part of it is not safe for public travel, and by reference to the City records they find that Williard street Ward One is an excepted street. They therefore recommend that a substantial bank Wall be laid on that part of Williard street adjoining the Estate of James Munroe Esq, and recommend the adoption of the accompanying order.
