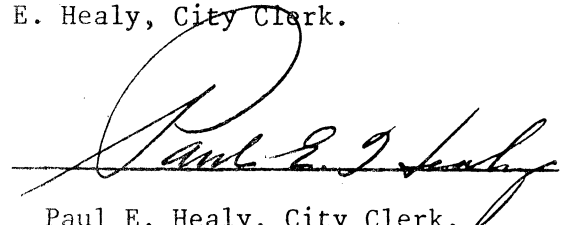
MAYOR RUSSELL

- WHEREAS: The City Council was recently made aware of a heroic act performed by John and Mary Davis, two Cambridge residents who instinctively came to the aid of an injured person; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. & Mrs. Davis, while on Shepard Street on May 17, 1984, were approached by Cambridge Parking Control Officer Thomas Litwinsky, who stated that he had just been shot and needed help; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. & Mrs. Davis immediately put Mr. Litwinsky into their automobile and took him to the Cambridge Hospital, arriving just two minutes after finding him, which, according to the attending physician, virtually saved Mr. Litwinsky's life; and
- WHEREAS: This type of humanitarian act should not go unnoticed by the "City Fathers", since far too often people in trouble go without help from anyone; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation and gratitude to John and Mary Davis for their concern and quick response for a fellow human being who was seriously injured; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. & Mrs. Davis on behalf of the City Council.
