- WHEREAS:** This City Council was deeply saddened by the death of John Riley, a veteran member of the Cambridge Police Department; and
- WHEREAS:** John Riley served the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as a State Trooper from December 1, 1938 to December 16, 1941 at which time he transferred to the Cambridge Police Department; and
- WHEREAS:** John held many assignments within the Police Department including the Traffic Division as a motorcycle officer and as the permanent police officer assigned at City Hall; and
- WHEREAS:** While assigned to the Hall, John always attempted to assist people looking for information — routing them to the appropriate department; and
- WHEREAS:** City Hall will not be the same place with the passing of such a fine fellow and a career police officer who's integrity and loyalty are beyond reproach; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on record extending our deepest sympathy to Mrs. Riley and her family at this time of sorrow; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family of Officer Riley as a permanent remembrance of him by this City Council; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council now adjourn as a symbol of our sorrow in learning of the death of a friend of this Council.
