

Cambridge, June 11. 1858.

To the Honorable, the Mayor and Aldermen of
the City of Cambridge.-

The undersigned respectfully
represents that, at the time when the Order for the removal
of certain incroachments upon Concord Avenue was
adopted by your Honorable Board, he was in great doubt
whether he was not upon the true line of the street, and
he hoped that upon a further examination, such might
prove to be the case. And for these reasons he felt reluc-
tant to give up any part of his land, already quite
narrow between Concord Avenue and Garden Street.

He respectfully submits that, although it would be a great
improvement to widen Concord Avenue as proposed, the ques-
tion of the true line of said Avenue is not altogether free
from doubt. He would further suggest that some change
for the better might perhaps be made in the line of Gar-
den Street.-

In view of all which, of the lateness of the season, and
of his intended absence for a time from the Commonwealth,

would rise and examine the present line of Garden Street
near its junction with Concord Avenue, and that, in the
