- WHEREAS: Fair and Progressive tax reform is urgently needed at the national level; and
- WHEREAS: On November 27, the federal Treasury Department proposed a tax reform plan that would reduce all tax rates, eliminate most deductions and exemptions, and increase corporate taxes; and
- WHEREAS: Although the Treasury's plan is not perfect, it would produce a radically simpler and fairer federal tax structure, benefit poor people most, increase taxes for only 20 percent of all individuals, and many instances of unfair benefits for special interests, and promote economic growth; and
- WHEREAS: The Treasury's plan stands no chance of passage unless those who represent the public interest, as opposed to the numerous special interests, unite behind it; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council endorses the Treasury Department's tax reform plan as a significant improvement of the federal tax structure, and calls upon the President to recommend it and Congress to enact it; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk send copies of this resolution to President Reagan, Treasury Secretary Regan, Speaker O'Neill, Senators Kennedy and Kerry, and the National League of Cities.
