

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Sixty-six.

An Ordinance establishing the Salary of
the Chief of Police, and defining his Duties.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City
of Cambridge, as follows:

Section 1. The Chief of Police shall be the
head of the department of the Cambridge Pol-
ice, and shall have precedence and entire
control of the department, its officers and
members, and of all constables and other of-
ficers when engaged in the service of the de-
partment. He shall devote his whole time
to the municipal affairs of the City, to pre-
serve the peace, order and cleanliness thereof.
He shall enforce all laws relating to the City,
and all ordinances thereof, the orders of the
City Council, and all orders and commands
of the Mayor and Aldermen. He shall take
notice of all nuisances, impediments and
obstructions in the streets, sidewalks, lanes,
alleys, courts, and public places and squares
of the City, and shall remove the same, or

take all proper action in relation thereto, under the direction of the Mayor and Aldermen. He shall receive all complaints of the officers or inhabitants respecting offenses committed against the laws of the Commonwealth and the ordinances of the City; he shall institute prosecutions against all offenders without unnecessary delay, and shall take all proper measures for their conviction. He shall also comply with all such regulations as may at any time be prescribed by the Mayor and Aldermen.

Section 2. He shall keep a careful record of his doings in the discharge of his office, and shall make a regular report thereof to the City Council as often as ordered in three months, and at such other times as they shall require.

Section 3. From and after the first day of January, in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-six, the Salary of the Chief of Police shall be twelve hundred dollars annually, payable in equal quarterly payments; which shall be in full for all services rendered by him in his official capacity.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordi-
nances inconsistent herewith, are hereby
repealed.
