Dear Mr. Corcoran:

The Massachusetts Council on Food, Nutrition and Health urges you to reconsider the eighteen-month budget for the Neighborhood Health Station Program.

The health services available to the residents of the low-income areas of Cambridge have been greatly improved by the Health Station Program. The program provides general adult medicine, geriatric care, ob-gyn care, social services and nutrition counseling. Without this program, health care is very limited to many residents of Cambridge. Because third parties, such as Medicare, Medicaid and insurance companies, will be billed for the services, the city will be reimbursed by the program. As a result, the Health Station's Program will not burden the taxpayers of Cambridge.

Again, we urge you to reconsider the proposed budget of the Neighborhood Health Station's Program.
