The joint Committee on Roads & Bridges who were instructed by an order, to inquire into the expediency of purchasing the Gravel bank at Pine Grove, belonging to the heirs of the late Edmund T. Hastings, have considered the same & respectfully report. The Committee find that the gravel has been removed from one half of the lot, proposed to be purchased and that there is not enough left to warrant so large an expenditure of money. The gravel is also of an inferior quality. The Committee are of the unanimous opinion that it would be inexpedient to purchase the same.
