WHEREAS: The Hildebrand has been a part of the City of Cambridge's network of services for homeless families for the past fourteen years and has helped many families restore their dignity and self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS: The special guest and featured speaker for this event will be award winning journalist Liz Walker news anchor for WBZ-TV 4; and

WHEREAS: Liz Walker joined WBZ-TV 4 in 1980 and distinguished herself as anchor for the station's evening newscasts. In June 2000, she chose to anchor the noonday newscast in order to spend more quality time with her family; and

WHEREAS: Ms. Walker received the prestigious Governor's Award from the New England branch of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences in 1977. She has also hosted and co-produced several documentaries for WBZ 4, including "Friends Like These", for which she received recognition from the prestigious Gabriel Awards; and

WHEREAS: An award winning community activist, Ms. Walker has served on committees and boards of the Big Sister Association, Boston's Children's Museum, the Urban League of Eastern Massachusetts and the Pediatric AIDS Charitable Trust of Boston. She has also spent much of her personal time speaking to young people about the importance of education and setting goals. In addition, she has supported AIDS awareness, breast cancer prevention and homelessness. She has also been involved with numerous groups such as the Project Hope Housing Project in Dorchester and the Newton Police Department Project D.A.R.E.; now therefore be it
