VICE MAYOR REEVES

- WHEREAS: Within the last several months it is reported that a theft of Cambridge City funds took place at the Cambridge Department of Traffic and Parking, and that the amount stolen was several thousand dollars. It has also come to light that it was reported that a Black man was responsible for this theft; and
- WHEREAS: It has further come to light that the theft was not by a Black man, but by an employee of the Department of Traffic and Parking, who has since admitted to the theft; and
- WHEREAS: It appears that this employee remains in the job; and on the City payroll; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council request the City Manager to conduct an investigation, and report back by Monday, January 7, 1991, with an explanation for why this person remains on the City payroll, and what is being done to prevent this from occurring again, such as ensuring that this person is no longer in a position to handle the City's money.

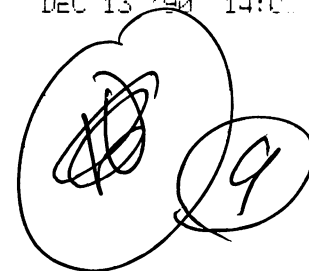
