- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of the Commonwealth's chief advocate for the elderly, Frank J. Manning; and
- WHEREAS: Frank, for the past twenty years has been associated with efforts to establish home care programs for the elderly, as well as to obtain higher living allowances for the elderly, living in nursing homes and other extended care facilities; and
- WHEREAS: He was a leader in developing opposition to attempts to cut back on medical services for elderly persons, as well as any attempt to attempt to establish a mandatory retirement age; and
- WHEREAS: Frank's passing creates a tremendous void in the advocacy for elder affairs throughout the Commonwealth, and although Frank will be succeeded by others, he will never be replaced; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Manning family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
