COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Joan DeGuglielmo will soon retire as Director of the Medical Record Department of the Cambridge Hospital; and
- WHEREAS: Joan, a life-long resident of Cambridge, attended local schools and Emmanuel College and in 1940 entered the Missionary Franciscan Sisters of the Immaculate Conception, making her temporary vows in 1943; unfortunately Joan left the convent due to illness in 1948; and
- WHEREAS: Joan first entered the service of the City in January of 1951 in the Admitting Office at the hospital and in May of that year transferred into the Medical Record Department, where she initiated several programs, such as the removal of old records (1917 to 1950) and the high school student training program; and
- WHEREAS: Through her long career, Joan received several promotions, her first being Senior Clerk Stenographer in 1956 and in 1968 she became Acting Director of the Medical Record Department, a job which required skill, intelligence and a degree of compassion, all of which Joan possessed; and
- WHEREAS: Joan was made permanent Director of the Medical Record Department in 1970, the position from which she will retire, completing thirty-one years of faithful and dedicated service on behalf of the people of Cambridge; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere appreciation and gratitude to Joan DeGuglielmo on the occasion of her retirement from the Cambridge Hospital; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Joan on behalf of the entire City Council.
