WHEREAS:

An offer has been received by the Mayor and City Council for the purchase of land situated on the easterly side of Portland Street, it is

ORDERED:

That His Honor the Mayor be and hereby is authorized, in the name of and in behalf of the City of Cambridge, to sell and convey to Robert Fawcett and Son Company, at the rate of 40¢ per square foot, a parcel of City land situated as follows:-

Beginning at a point in the northerly line of Thorndike Street distant 127.2 ft. easterly from the intersection of said line with the easterly line of Portland Street, thence running northerly at right angles to Thorndike Street 55 feet to an angle, thence easterly by a line parallel to and 55 ft. distant northerly from said northerly line about 80 ft. to its intersection with the westerly location line of the Boston and Albany Railroad Company, thence southerly along said westerly line about 55 ft. to its intersection with the northerly line of Thorndike Street, thence westerly along said northerly line 78 ft. to the point of beginning. Containing 4,345 sq. ft. more or less.

The above described parcel of land is shown upon a plan entitled: "Plan of Extension of Thorndike Street for Acceptance" dated April 20, 1897 drawn in the Office of the City Engineer of Cambridge, Mass. and on file in said office.
