WHEREAS: Pedestrians walking on City streets have the right to move free from potentially dangerous obstructions; and

WHEREAS: Persons using wheelchairs have the right to access sidewalks from curb cuts free of potentially dangerous obstructions; and

WHEREAS: A sandwich board, chained to a lamp post at the corner of Prospect Street and Massachusetts Avenue, obstructs passage on that portion of the sidewalk and stands unreasonably close to a curb cut; and

WHEREAS: This Central Square street corner is particularly well-traveled pedestrian area with the potential for sidewalk congestion, and therefore injury, should such an obstruction remain; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council request the City Manager to investigate the matter of the above mentioned sandwich board with a view to removing it to a more appropriate location.
