- WHEREAS:** The Most Reverend Paulino L. Evora, Bishop of the Republic of Cape Verde, will visit Capeverdean communities such as: Casa de Comunidade Cabo Verdeana in Boston and other cities in Massachusetts and Rhode Island. While in the United States, he will be administering confirmation to hundreds of children in the cities of Boston, Scituate, Brockton, New Bedford and Pawtucket; and
- WHEREAS:** Bishop Evora was born in Cape Verde in 1931 and studied in Portugal, where he was ordained a priest in 1962. From 1963 to 1965, he was a college professor in Braga, Portugal. In 1965 he left for Angola where he worked as a missionary until 1975, when he was consecrated a bishop; and
- WHEREAS:** Bishop Evora resumed his duties in Cape Verde in June, 1975, one month before that country gained its independence from Portugal; and
- WHEREAS:** During his visit to the United States, Bishop Evora will attend a dinner in his honor and a reception on May 10, 1989 at the Cape Verean Community House, Inc., 339 Dudley Street, Roxbury, MA, where he is presently Board of Directors. He will preside over the Capeverdean Annual Parade in Boston, on May 14, 1989; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, welcome Bishop Evora and wish him a very happy and successful visit to New England.
