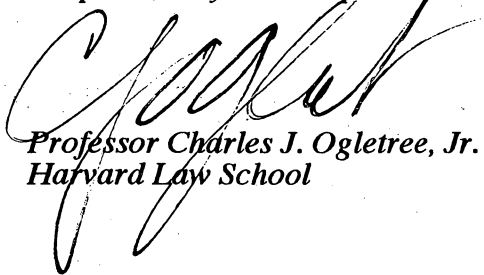

Mission: To ensure that Black elementary school-aged children master the basic skills of reading, writing, and arithmetic, have a high level of self-esteem, and have a deep love for and commitment to community service and uplift.

Accomplishments: Last year, The B.E.L.L. Foundation:

- recruited, trained, and placed 212 college and graduate student volunteers who provided over 15,000 hours of tutoring and mentoring to our scholars;
- dramatically improved the mathematics and literacy skills of 81% of our children; and
- was honored by President Clinton as one of the nation's most outstanding community service organizations.

W.E.B. DuBois Academy

Mission: To provide African-American males with a high quality supplementary education presented by successfully employed African-American men in an effort to effect change in the lives of African-American male children and the Black community.

Accomplishments: Last year:

- 74% of the students felt that the program helped them do better in school; and
- 65% believed that their behavior improved as a result of participating in the Academy.

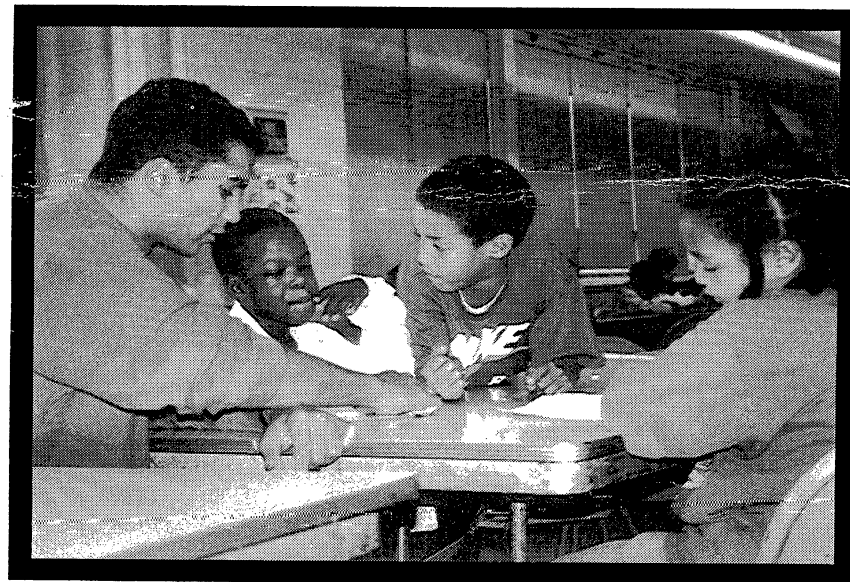

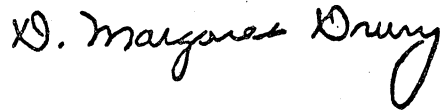
