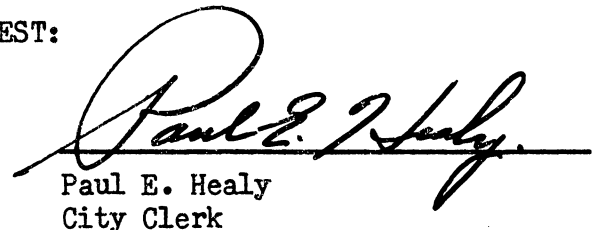
RESOLVED:
