WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Henry street, so called, between Brookline and Sidney streets,*

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *forty feet* in width between *Brookline and Sidney*

streets

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, *the* several owners and abutters therein, having agreed in writing to waive all claims on account of land taken.

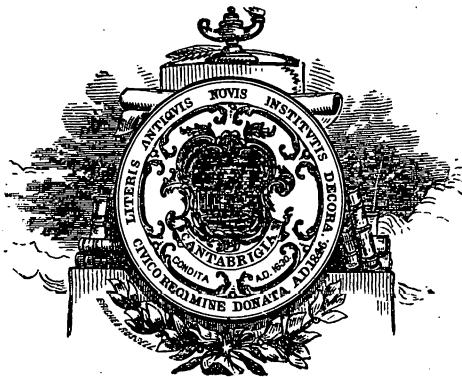
