" Fire Department and Police Department."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Section 7 of Ordinance entitled Fire Department and Police Department is hereby amended by adding after the word "men" in the ninth line the words " and two police women." ^{the salary} As amended said section to read as ~~follows~~ follows:

Section 7. The police department shall maintain not less than three police stations, one central station with police headquarters, ~~central~~ centrally located, one station in North Cambridge and one station in East Cambridge. The police force shall consist of at least 145 regular men and not more than 155 regular men and two police women. ^{The salary of the police women shall be \$1000 per year} The fire department shall maintain 13 stations. The fire force shall consist of at least 115 permanent men and not more than 135 permanent and call men.

In amendment of an Ordinance entitled:-

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Section 7 of Ordinance entitled "Fire Department and Police Department" is hereby amended by adding after the word "men" in the ninth line the words "and one police woman". The salary of the police woman shall be \$1000 per year. As amended said section to read as follows:-

Section 7. The police department shall maintain not less than three police stations, one central station with police headquarters, centrally located, one station in North Cambridge and one station in East Cambridge. The police force shall consist of at least 145 regular men and not more than 155 regular men and one police woman. The salary of the police woman shall be \$1000 per year. The fire department shall maintain 13 stations. The fire force shall consist of at least 115 permanent men and not more than 135 permanent and call men.

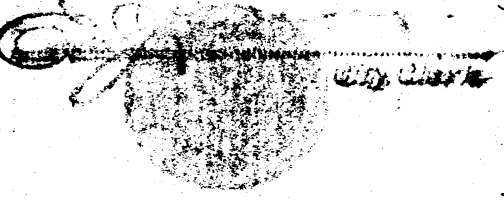

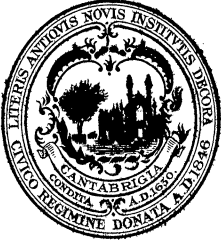

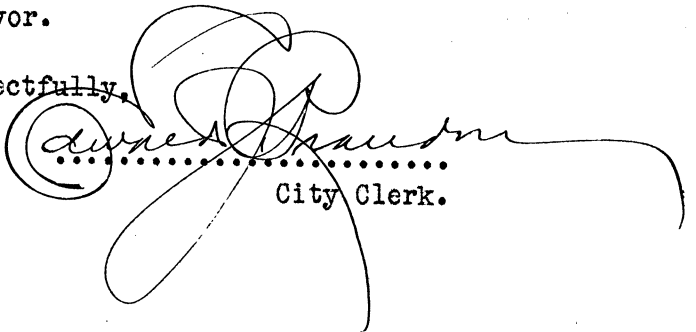
