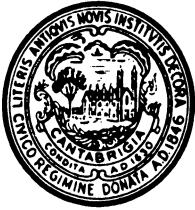

Subject City Council Order #17 of May 1, 1989 Re:"Parking at the Green St. Garage"

The parking at the Green-Franklin-Pearl Municipal Garage is utilized during the day time hours to its maximum. What this means is that the number of monthly parkers allowed has reached its total. To allow any more monthly parkers during the daytime hours would only force short-term shoppers to find some other place to park. The garage was built for residents of the elderly housing and shoppers in the Central Square area.

As for the night time parking with the exception of Friday and Saturday when the garage is almost at capacity we could lease more night monthly spaces. We currently have police officers who do lease some monthly spaces. If any officer wishes to lease a monthly space, they can apply at the garage office and file an application for a space. We do have a list waiting for daytime spaces but as they become available we issue new leases.

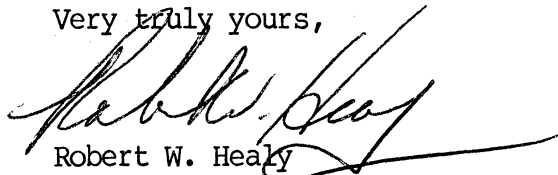
