Subject City Council Order No. 15 of January 17, 1977--Traffic and Parking Problems at Garden and Walden Streets

I have completed a traffic study of this intersection and find that the traffic and parking problem in this area is caused by the parents of children attending the Montesorri School. These parents who drop off and pick up their children on Garden Street and use the residents driveway to turn around are creating a dangerous traffic condition which is compounded by the fact that there is snow and ice narrowing the width of the street.

I have contacted officials of the school and they have sent out flyers to parents advising them that they will be tagged if they continue to park there, telling them that these driveways are private property and they should respect the residents' privacy in the area. They are also informing them that there is adequate space on school property to park and to start using this location for dropping off and picking up their children.

I have also informed the residents that I will be installing No Parking along this stretch of road and will send a Parking Control Officer to tag this area.

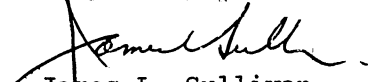
