Captain Donahue steadily rose through the ranks of the department, becoming an aide to the Deputy Chief on May 28, 1963, a position he held until he was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant on November 22, 1964 and eight years later, promoted again to the rank of Captain, assigned to Engine Company #4 until October 21, 1973, at which time, he was given his last assignment to Aerial Tower #1, and

Captain Donohue was always respected by the men he worked with for being an objective and sincere officer of the Fire Department, now therefore be it
