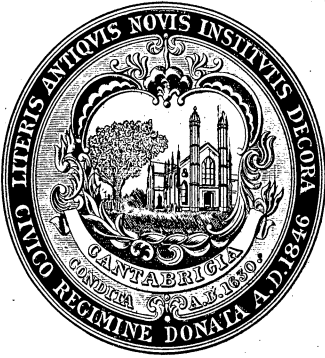

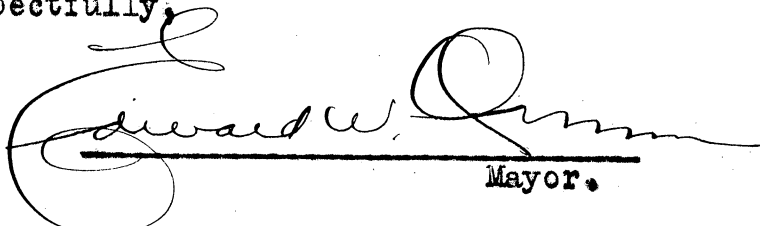

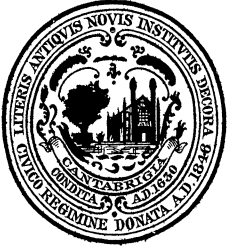

Dear Sir-

I enclose petition of the McKinley Meter Company to purchase a small portion of land outside the chain link fence at Mill Pond Playground, as per sketch accompanying petition.

The Board of Park Commissioners at a meeting held May 2nd, 1921, voted to recommend the sale of this land as described below for the sum of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.--) The land is no longer required for public purposes; and the Board wished to notify the City Council to this effect;

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Gilmore Street at its intersection with the division line between land of Archie J. Card and land of the City of Cambridge, thence running southeasterly along said division line about 24.7 feet to the division line between land of city of Cambridge and land now or formerly of Mary A. Mulvahill, thence westerly along said last named division line about 53.6 feet to the division line between land of said Mulvahill and land now or formerly of Max Hill, thence northerly along said division line extended northerly about 9 feet to its intersection with the fence line on the southerly side of the "Mill Pond Lot" so called, thence easterly along said fence as the fence now stands about 50 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 1,079 square feet more or less.

WHEREAS:

Notice has been received from the Board of Park Commissioners declaring that, in its opinion, a certain portion of land hereinafter described, situated on the southerly side of the "Mill Pond Lot" so-called, is no longer required for public purposes, it is

ORDERED:

That His Honor the Mayor be and hereby is authorized, in the name of and in behalf of the City of Cambridge, to sell and convey said parcel of land for a sum not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100). Said parcel of land is bounded and described as follows:-

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Gilmore Street at its intersection with the division line between land of Archie J. Card and land of the City of Cambridge, thence running southeasterly along said division line about 24.7 feet to the division line between land of said city and land now or formerly of Mary A. Mulvahill, thence westerly along said last named division line about 53.6 feet to the division line between land of said Mulvahill and land now or formerly of Max Hill, thence northerly along said division line extended northerly about 9 feet to its intersection with the fence line on the southerly side of the "Mill Pond Lot", so-called, thence easterly along said fence line as the fence now stands about 50 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 1,079 square feet more or less.

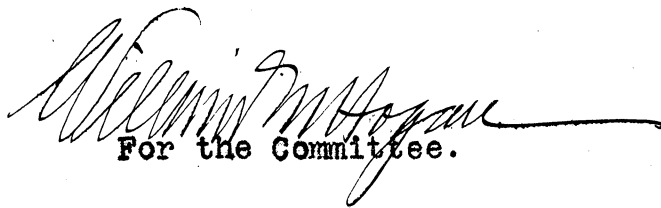
