- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of M. Lester Gilmore, a long time Cambridge resident and former faculty member at Cambridge Rindge and Latin School; and
- WHEREAS: Lester attended local public schools, graduating from Cambridge High and Latin in 1943 and joining the United States Marine Corps in 1944, serving with the 52nd Defense Battalion, the only black Marine unit in World War II; seeing action in the Philippines and on Iwo Jima; and
- WHEREAS: Once he was honorably discharged, he later attended the New School of Social Research in New York City, where he studied drama and acting and continued his education in Boston at Emerson College, graduating in 1953; and
- WHEREAS: Lester taught in both the Boston and Cambridge public school systems, as well as directing and performing in many plays, including Shakespeare's "Othello"; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Gilmore was also a deacon in the Prospect Street Congregational Church for many years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Gilmore family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
