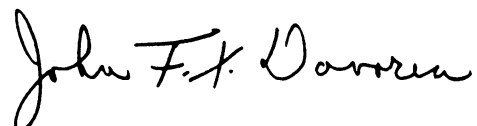

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

Community Association Serving Alcoholics, Inc.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

- I. To provide a forum for the identification of common needs and problems among the membership.
- II. To serve as co-ordinating body for the improvement and expansion of services to alcoholics.
- III. To stimulate and/or sponsor educational and research programs in alcoholism.

Further, the corporation shall have the power to engage in any activity, exercise any power and enjoy any privilege not inconsistent with the purposes stated herein; with Section 4 of Chapter 180 of the General Laws or with Section 501(c) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service Code of 1954, as amended, or any successor statutes to the above, further, the corporation shall have all of the powers set forth in Section 6 of Chapter 180 and such powers set forth in Section 9 of Chapter 156B as are conferred by the said Section 6 of Chapter 180.

Pursuant to a communication from the Secretary of State re: "Community Association Serving Alcoholics, Inc.," I made an investigation.

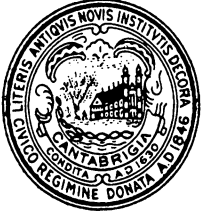

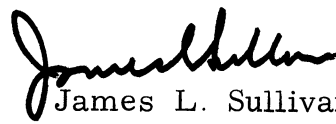
