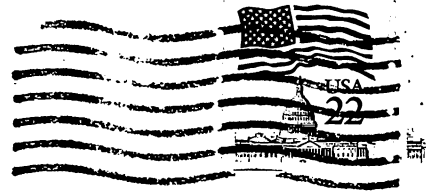
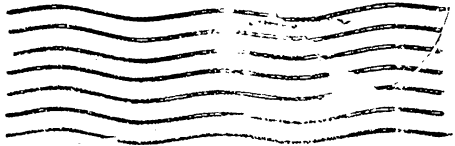

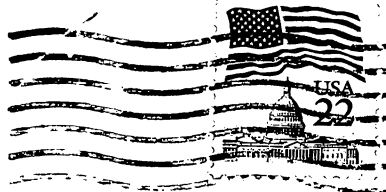

Massachusetts city bans tests on lab animals

From Wire Reports

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — The Cambridge City Council voted unanimously Monday night to enact a first-in-the-nation ban on commercial laboratory testing of animals within the city.

Before a crowd of supporters and the glare of television lights, all nine council members voted without discussion to approve the proposal, which subjects laboratories to fines of up to \$250 per day.

In addition, the ban stipulates that any research institution committing serious or repeated violations of the ordinance may be closed by the director of the city's Animal Commission.

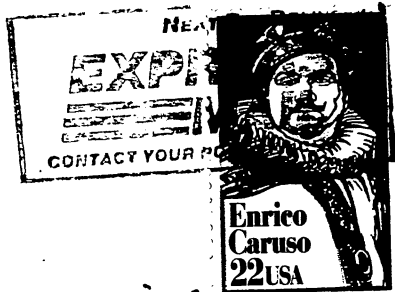
The ban will affect research on more than 50,000 animals now taking place within the 6-square-mile city, officials estimated.

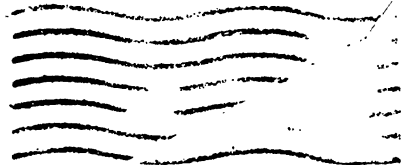

If you care that much about animals,

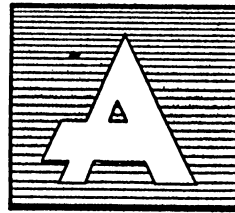
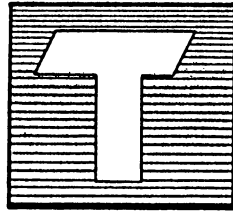
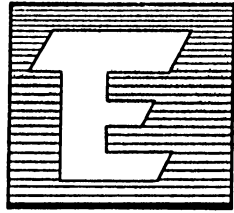
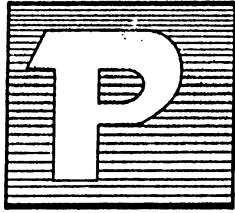

Illinois' Simon formally enters presidential race

CARBONDALE, Ill. — Sen. Paul Simon of Illinois Monday became the fourth Democrat to announce for his party's 1988 presidential nomination, offering himself as a true Democrat who will

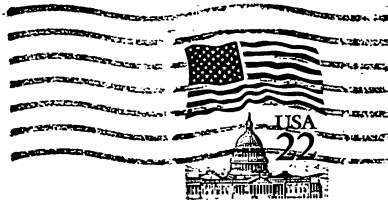
City Council voted Monday night to enact a first-in-the-nation ban on laboratory testing of animals for cosmetics, tobacco products, industrial chemicals, pesticides and engine exhaust. All nine council members voted without discussion to approve the proposal, which subjects laboratories ignoring the ban to up to \$250 in fines per violation per day. Test animals used for research in Cambridge include dogs, rabbits, guinea pigs, cats, mice, birds, rats, monkeys, ferrets and hamsters, officials said. The ordinance does not affect researchers who conduct laboratory tests of animals for human medical research.

Clarification, Section A

There are two separate deadlines involved in filing the new W-4 or W-4A tax withholding forms. Every employee must file one of the forms no later than Oct. 1, according to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). But workers have only until June 1 to demonstrate a "good faith" effort to withhold the right amount from their paychecks. If workers do not file the form by June 1, and end up having withheld less than

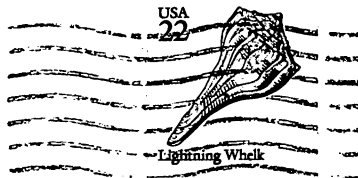
Gentlemen;

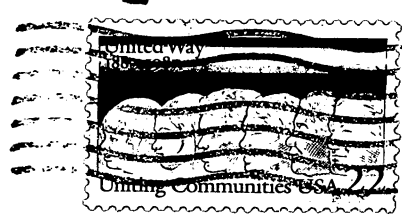

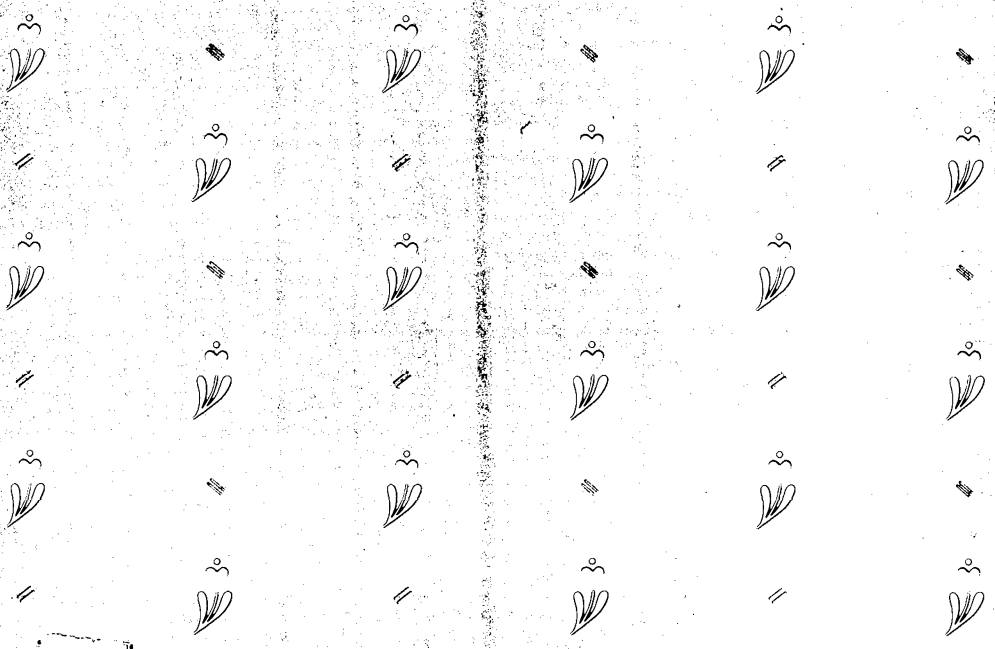
