Bigelow, and all other persons interested in the estate late of Welch, Bigelow & Co., or in any other way interested, that this Board intends to widen the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as a Public Street; and that due notice be given to all persons and parties owning or having any rights in estates that will be benefitted by the said proposed alteration of said Street, that this Board intends to assess a portion of the expense thereof upon the estates so benefitted according to law — and that
