

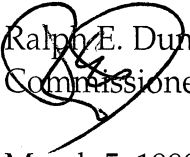

Re: Report on the Progress on Bulletin
Boards in Neighborhood Parks

To date there are twelve parks which contain bulletin boards. The locations are well distributed in all three sections of the City. Communication has been made with Alberico Park area residents and we have scheduled the installation of a bulletin board in that park for early Spring.

Public Works will ensure that the criteria for the installation of bulletin boards be reviewed by the Open Space Committee during the planning phase of all future park renovations. Parks scheduled for re-construction will have bulletin boards similar to the one located in Sennott Park (brightly colored and made of composite material).

Bulletin boards made at Public Works are made from pressure treated lumber and have been successful in areas like Dana and Raymond Parks. These type of boards will be made available in parks where community process has been involved and boards are welcomed.
