WHEREAS: The Police Commissioner has developed a grant proposal to develop and implement a Community Policing Partnership; and

WHEREAS: The proposal requests \$300,000 from the State Executive Office of Public Safety to carry out a "multi-faceted approach to demand reduction and drug prevention; and

WHEREAS: The support of the Mayor of Cambridge and the Cambridge City Council would be most helpful in obtaining such a grant; and

WHEREAS: It is, in fact, the strong desire of the Cambridge City Council that the community policing strategy be implemented in a forceful fashion in recognition of the importance of close ties between sworn police officers and citizens of Cambridge; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council, recognizing the importance of community policing in the efforts to reducing and eventually abolishing drugs in the City of Cambridge does hereby support the efforts of the Police Commissioner in obtaining additional funds from the Executive Office of Public Safety and urges that such funds be made available to the City of Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Executive Office of Public Safety, the Speaker of the House, and to our entire delegation on Beacon Hill.
