- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council takes this moment to recognize the work being done to stop domestic violence and provide safety for Cambridge children; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council recognize the particular efforts of those who have been trained through Allison Schaeve of the Department of Public Health with the Domestic Violence Free Initiative of the Cambridge Women's Commission, Steven Brion-Meisels of Drop Out Prevention and Kim DeAndrade of Cambridge School Department Health; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council recognizes today those safety people now trained with domestic violence awareness and skills to meet the needs of our children including the 13 trained personnel from early childhood programs within the Cambridge public schools from Special Start, Even Start and the Home Visitor Program; the 35 child care centers affiliated with the Cambridge Community Partnership for Children; and the teams from each elementary school and CRLS.
