and it is further

Ordered

That a City Debt be Created

for the sum of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) for the purpose of constructing sewers for sanitary and drainage purposes as authorized by Section 5 (1) Chapter 719, Acts of the Year 1913,

and from time to time as the City Treasurer may deem necessary bonds of the City will be issued not exceeding that amount, either in the form of registered or coupon bonds, one or both, to be styled

SEWER LOAN

said bonds to be dated July 1, 1917 and payable \$1500 each year 1918 to 1927 inclusive and \$1000 each year 1928 to 1947 inclusive

with interest at the rate of not exceeding $4\frac{1}{2}$ per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; that the Mayor, City Auditor and City Treasurer be and are hereby authorized and instructed to sign and execute said bonds and all transfers and exchanges of the same in the manner directed by the ordinances of the City, and that the City Treasurer be and is hereby directed to bargain and sell, and is hereby authorized to transfer and exchange the same.

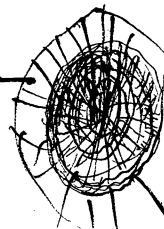

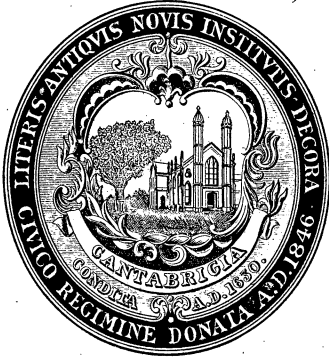

City of Cambridge:--

In the estimate for the needs of the Department of Engineering and Sewers submitted to me on January 11th, 1917, the City Engineer makes this recommendation:--

sections of
" That the separate system of sewers be introduced into East Cambridge which are now suffering from defective drainage. No money has been expended so far for this purpose in the East Cambridge section, and in the vicinity of Bridge street the conditions are such as to render it highly desirable to lay a separate system sewer from Bridge street at Fourth street to connect with the Metropolitan Sewer at Cambridge and Warren Streets. Also a sewer in Bridge street between Cambridge street and Commercial avenue."

The engineer estimates the cost of construction of this separate system as approximately \$35,000.00.

In view of the tax on the present system and the danger of backing up of sewerage because of the inability of the present system to handle the discharge, I recommend that your Honorable Board authorize a loan for Thirty-five Thousand (\$35,000.) dollars, by the creation of a city debt.

I enclose herewith an appropriation and loan order to meet these requirements, and recommend that the same be adopted.
