WHEREAS: To combat domestic violence, everyone must be courageous and step forward to take a stand, family members, policy makers, bystanders, and general members of the community; and

WHEREAS: In Cambridge, there is such a campaign against domestic violence, led by the Domestic Violence Task Force, a coalition of activists and community leaders; and

WHEREAS: The Domestic Violence Task Force will hold a public hearing to discuss ways that the legal system might better serve victims of domestic abuse. This hearing will be held on Wednesday, October 21, 1992 at 7:30pm, at the City Council Chamber; and

WHEREAS: Their efforts are to be commended and supported; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council extend its support for the Domestic Violence Task Force, and does encourage residents who are concerned about the issue of violence in the home and the government's response, to come and share their views.
