RESOLVED: That I, Mayor Kenneth E. Reeves, and the entire Cambridge City Council hereby proclaim June 16, 1993 as DAY OF THE AFRICAN CHILD and urge all citizens to recognize the violent struggles of Africa's past and its many significant gains and contributions to date in ensuring a bright and prosperous future.
