We citizens, acting under auspices of the organization HOP, propose, in respectful appreciation of the services of City workers and others whose labors affect us all, the following Resolution: Be it resolved that a parade be organized for the third day of December, Nineteen Hundred and Sixty Nine, to give thanks, in the true spirit of Thanksgiving, to the City Workers of Cambridge, who do their respective jobs year 'round to the common benefit of all.

Be it further resolved that this parade include city vehicles such as streetsweepers and garbage trucks, in addition to the more commonly seen official vehicles, in recognition of the valuable service they and their operators render.

Be it also resolved that the time, route, possible additions to parade personnel, and details of execution be left to the discretion of the City Council or its appointed agents.
