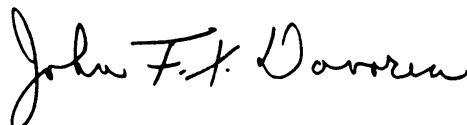

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To establish an educational and theatrical performing group to produce, create, direct, and otherwise formulate meaningful, educational, literary, entertaining, musical, dramatic, performing and graphic productions;

to stimulate, promote, and develop interests in the community in the dramatic and performing arts;

to educate the American public in the dramatic and performing arts;

to advance the national as well as local culture in the field of dramatic and performing arts;

to bring these arts to areas and segments of the population that are not adequately served;

to bring these arts to audiences encompassing a broad spectrum of ages, experiences, economical and cultural backgrounds;

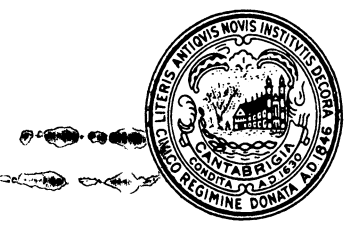
to hire actors, musicians, directors, designers, stage managers, producers, electricians, stage carpenters, stage hands, accountants, lawyers, bookkeepers, publicity and promotions directors, instructors and lecturers, and all other performing, technical, office, professional

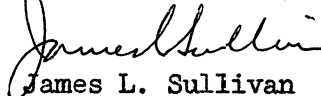
