- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Reverend Father Luke Arakelian C.M.V.D., Pastor of the Holy Cross Armenian Catholic Church of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: "Father Luke" born in Constanza, Romania, received his secondary education in Venice, Italy under the direction of the Mekhitarists; and
- WHEREAS: Upon completion of his studies, Father Luke returned to work several years in Bucharest, Romania before entering the monastery in Vienna to become a member of the "Armenian Benedictions", a Mekhitarist religious congregation; and
- WHEREAS: Father Luke was ordained in 1942 and in 1949, he was assigned to the Holy Cross parish where he sponsored families displaced by World War II; and
- WHEREAS: Father Luke assumed leadership of the parish in 1951, and he established the St. Gregory Camp at Cape Cod, where Armenian youths could learn to speak Armenian during the Summer as well as founding a camp for senior citizens; and
- WHEREAS: As a member of the Mekhitarist fathers of Vienna, Father Luke served as Chancellor of the Armenian Catholic Exarchate of the United States and Canada which was established by Pope' John Paul II in 1981; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Father Luke Arakelian at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Arakelian family on behalf of the entire City Council.

The Rev. Luke G. Arakelian, a pastor at the Holy Cross Armenian Catholic Church, died Saturday in Cambridge after a brief illness. He was 74.

Born in Constanza, Romania, Father Arakelian received his secondary education in Venice.

After working several years in Bucharest, Romania, he entered a monastery in Vienna to become a member of the "Armenian Benedictines," a Mekhitarist religious congregation.

In 1949, Father Arakelian was sent to the Holy Cross parish in Cambridge, where he sponsored families displaced by World War II. In 1951, he assumed leadership of the parish.

He established the St. Gregory Camp at Cape Cod, where Armenian youths could learn to speak Armenian dur-

ing the summer. He also founded a camp for senior citizens.

A member of the Mekhitarist Fathers of Vienna, Father Arakelian served as chancellor of the Armenian Catholic Exarchate of the United States and Canada, which was established by Pope John Paul II in 1982.

He is survived by two brothers, Baruir of Romania and Arakel of the U.S.S.R.; one sister, Isabella Arakelian of Falmouth; and a niece, Musa Khachaturian of Romania.

Pursuant to the provision of M.G.L. c.6A ss 31-77 and in accordance with M.G.L. c.30A, as amended, a public hearing will be held by the Rate Setting Commission on August 6, 1990 at 9:30 a.m., relative to regulations: 114.2 CMR 2.00 - Rates of Payment to Long-Term Care Facilities; 114.2 CMR 5.00 - Prospective Rates of Payment to Long-Term Care Facilities. These amendments affect long-term care facilities that were being reimbursed on the prospective case-mix system beginning in 1988. Specifically, the amendment removes the payment of working capital interest due on final rates from the prospective rate and inputs the amount due into the last final rate set for facilities after they move to the prospective system. These amendments will prevent the over or underpayment to nursing home providers. Based upon available data, there will be no aggregate increase in Title XIX expenditures associated with these amendments. All persons desiring to be heard in these matters are hereby notified to appear at the designated time and place. Persons who notify the Commission in advance of the hearing of their intention to speak will be afforded an early opportunity to testify if such notification is received before 5:00 p.m. on August 3, 1990. All other interested persons will be heard subsequent to those who have filed a written request or statement. A copy of this notice is being sent to H.C.F.A. Regional Office in reference to 42 C.F.R. part 447.254. Copies of the proposed amendments are available for inspection and copies of the full texts may be purchased at the office of the Commission, Two Boylston Street, Boston, Massachusetts 02116. OBITUARY

(for the Pilot)

Reverend Father Luke Arakelian, C.M.Vd., 74, pastor of Holy Cross Armenian Catholic Church of Cambridge, Mass died ... (state when)

Known affectionately as "Father Luke," this cheerful, compassionate, and energetic servant of God ends 41 years of service to his Armenian Catholic parishioners throughout New England and to the community at large. His warm-hearted engaging and dynamic personality, as well as his fine priestly character have earned him widespread friendship and respect.

Fr. Luke was born in Constanza, Roumania in 1915. His father sent young "Garbis" to Venice, Italy for his secondary education so that under the Mekhitarists he would become well-versed in Armenian subjects. On his return, he worked several years in Bucarest, Roumania, and then decided to go to the Motherhouse in Vienna, Austria to become a member of the Mekhitarist religious congregation, the "Armenian Benedictines." After persevering through years of preparation and study, in 1942, amid the blood and fire of World War II, he was ordained a "priest forever" by the General Abbot, Archbishop Mesrob Habozian.

For seven years he continued his studies at the Monastery. In 1949, he was sent on his first outside assignment to Holy Cross parish, Watertown, Mass., where for 10 years the learned and holy Mekhitarist, the beloved Fr. Sahag Kogian had been organizing an Armenian Catholic community out of a scattered flock. Immediately on his arrival, Fr. Luke actively sponsored a large number of World War II displaced families, finding them homes and jobs in America. In 1951, he took on the burdens of the parish after Fr. Kogian was consecrated a bishop and sent to

Beirut, Lebanon as patriarchal vicar.

In a few years, he was able to acquire an edifice at Harvard Square, which he renovated into a beautiful Armenian Church. Today, after many years, that church has become the pride and joy of the parishioners and its "venerable old pastor."

True to the dictum of St. Paul, Fr. Luke dedicated his whole life "To The Greater Glory of God". He published a series of books and pamphlets under that banner, abbreviated "M.A.P." in Armenian. These include a set of Armenian Grammars and cassettes, "The Armenian Liturgy", and a series of booklets honoring various Armenian Church dignitaries and local ordinaries of the Boston Archdiocese. His latest works being prepared for publication are excerpts of his sermons.

Fr. Luke spread his good cheer to young and old alike everywhere. He established, and for many years ran St. Gregory Camp at Cape Cod where Armenian youths from all over could spend their summer fun and learn Armenian. Not to neglect the elderly, he also formed a summer camp for senior citizens and their families and he himself drove them on trips around the countryside, year round, in the school bus.

Most importantly, Fr. Luke never forgot his primary priestly role as "another Christ". No matter the hour nor the distance, he would rush to administer the healing sacraments and bring consolation to the sick and bereaved. Recently, sensing that his illness would soon be overtaking him, he reminded us that "In over 40 years I have never missed celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of Christ in our beloved Armenian Liturgy." What better guarantee that this servant of God has now begun to enjoy his eternal reward.

Of his immediate family, he leaves behind a sister, Isabella Arakelian of Falmouth, Mass.; in Roumania, a brother, Baruyr and a niece, Musa Khachaturian; and in Russia, a brother, Arakel and his family.
