- WHEREAS: On April 1, 1990, Bill Cleary will take over the reins of the Harvard Athletic Department after serving as it's Varsity Hockey Coach for nineteen seasons; and
- WHEREAS: During his tenure, the team amassed a record of 323-196-22, reaching the NCAA Final Four on seven occasions making it to the NCAA Finals three times, and took the National Championship in 1989; and
- WHEREAS: Under his leadership, the Crimson has won two Eastern College Athletic Conference tournament titles, four Beanpot Championships and ten Ivy League Championships; and
- WHEREAS: As a player, he was known for his skating abilities and still holds four university records as well as a member of two U.S. Olympic hockey teams - the 1956 Silver Medal Winners and the 1960 Gold Medal team; and
- WHEREAS: Bill Cleary was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 1977 and was also named to the 24-man "Golden Years Dream Team" composed of Olympic hockey players from the last 50 years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record extending its heartiest congratulations and best wishes to Coach Bill Cleary as he begins to assume his new duties as Athletic Director; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Cleary on behalf of the entire City Council.
