Cambridge Sept 20. 1882

Whereas in a number of places in this City, posts are standing upon the sidewalks at such distances from the curbstone as to endanger the public safety, particularly in the night time, when persons are most liable to come in contact with them, thereby not only causing injury to such individuals but rendering the City responsible for damage which may result by allowing such obstructions to exist,

To avoid the occurrence of such accidents, it is hereby ordered that the Superintendent of Streets, under the direction of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, be required to cause the removal of such obstructions, forthwith, and that hereafter the rule (as regards distance from curbstone) which is adopted in the erection of Lamp Posts, shall apply to the placing of hitching or other posts upon the sidewalks in any part of the City.
