Rev. Leo R. Mahoney, retired pastor, at 71

The Rev. Leo R. Mahoney of Cambridge, former pastor of Christ the King Church in Hudson, died Wednesday at Mount Auburn Hospital in Cambridge. He was 71.

Born in Cambridge, he was educated at St. John's Seminary in Brighton. He was ordained Feb. 2, 1953, at Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston.

Father Mahoney had also served at Sacred Heart in Lexington, St. Luke in Belmont, Society of St. James the Apostle in Peru, St. Mary in Waltham,

Blessed Sacrament in Cambridge and St. Clement in Somerville. He retired a month ago.

Father Mahoney is survived by two sisters, Marie of Cambridge and Ann Kelley of Brighton.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. tomorrow at Christ the King Church, Hudson.

Burial will be in Cambridge Cemetery, Cambridge.
