A PROCLAMATION

DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE OF THE VICTIMS OF THE HOLOCAUST

April 10 through April 17, 1983

- WHEREAS: Less than forty years ago, six million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other people suffered as victims of Nazism, and
- WHEREAS: The people of the City of Cambridge should always remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such horrors never be repeated; and
- WHEREAS: The people of the City of Cambridge should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people, and
- WHEREAS: The people of the City of Cambridge should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and
- WHEREAS: April 10 has been designated pursuant to an Act of Congress and internationally as a Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known as Yom Hashoah; and
- WHEREAS: It is appropriate for the people of the City of Cambridge to join in the international commemoration, and

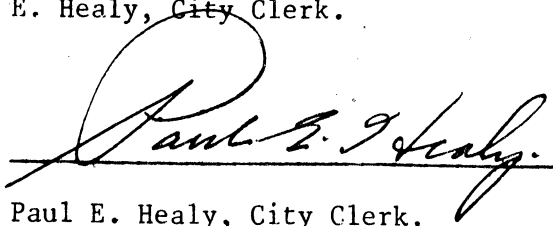
Now, Therefore, As the Mayor of Cambridge, I ask the City Council to join me by stating that it is;

- RESOLVED: That in memory of the victims of the Holocaust and in the hope that we will strive always to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through education, vigilance and resistance, the week of April 10 through April 17, 1983, is hereby designated as the Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Mayor proceed to plan an appropriate ceremony for the City of Cambridge.
