Subject City Council Order #10 of 11/20/89, Re: Issuance of Visitor Parking Permits

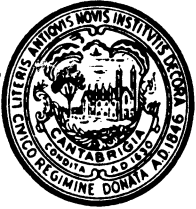
The Traffic Department in its effort to cut down the number of permit abuses created by the large number issued in previous years is now issuing one permit per household. However, we are, upon request issuing two visitor permits to the elderly residents, handicapped persons, people who are ill and to those residents who show a need for them.

During the past month we have talked to many residents concerning the issuance of only one permit and the reasons why we are trying this and most of the residents understand what we are trying to do.

We are also asking for comments on the one permit issue in order to evaluate this program which will decide whether we stay with one permit or return to the two permit system.

It is our opinion that the one permit system is worth a trial period as there are far too many permits issued than there are parking spaces.
