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I am please to transmit for approval of the City Council the grant award from the Department of Labor in the amount of (\$25,000) for the development of a Comprehensive Manpower Program.

As you know, the receipt of this grant award is the culmination of a three year effort on the part of the City of Cambridge to develop an independant capacity to develop, plan and administer manpower programs for its citizens. The active support of you, as City Manager, together with that of former Mayor Vellucci and all members of the City Council combined with the endless hours of selfless effort by such people as Pat Cusick of C.E.O.C. and Alan Toothacre formerly of our staff.

This Operational Planning Grant, together with our pending designation as an independant Manpower Area Planning Council offers to Cambridge a unique opportunity to improve our manpower planning capacity, prepare for Special Manpower Revenue Sharing and to establish new and expanding intergovernmental relationships with our sister communities of Somerville, Arlington, Watertown and Belmont as well as with the State and Federal governments.

During the past three years Cambridge has emerged as a leader in manpower planning for our five (5) community region serving over three hundred thousand citizens or 5% of the total state population.

In 1971 the City of Cambridge received its first grant from the Department of Labor in the amount of approximately (\$75,000). That amount gradually increased to (\$283,000) in 1972 for the Cambridge AMPB region funding such programs as the Neighborhood Youth Corps and after a strong and consistent battle increased to a new funding level of (\$1,003,000) in 1973 allowing for increased services to all ages and neighborhoods for job placement and training.

With the planning grant and our designation as an MAPC, we will begin the 1974 planning period with the hope of increasing our funding opportunities, consolidating administrative functions, and providing greater linkages with the School Department's Occupational Education Programs and with the new office of Manpower and Economic Development in Cambridge, and its counterpart in the other participating communities.

Favorable action on this grant award will bring Cambridge one step closer to a position of strength in manpower planning.

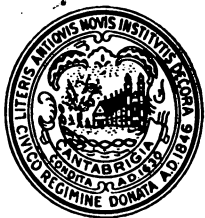


